PROGRAM	Pacific College, Costa Mesa, Vocational Nursing Program (Program) (Program Director: Denise Boren, Costa Mesa, Orange County, Private)

Please note: Board Nursing Education Consultants make recommendations. The recommendations are forwarded to the Education and Practice Committee for review and recommendation or to the Executive Officer or full Board for action.

PROGRAM REQUEST:

Continued Program Approval

Admit a class of 20 students to commence on October 20, 2026, with a graduation date of August 27, 2028. This class replaces the class that graduated on November 9, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

On August 15, 2025, the Program was placed on provisional approval for a two-year period.

On March 1, 2026, the Program Director submitted the required comprehensive analysis.

On May 11, 2026, the Program Director submitted a Form 55M-15 (New 04/2022) with supporting documents for review. A site visit was conducted by two NECs on May 19 and 20, 2026. The Program was reviewed to determine compliance with Article 5 of California Code of Regulations, Title 16.

On May 27, 2026, the notice of violations was sent to the Program Director.

On May 31, 2026, the Program submitted the required documents requesting to admit a class of 20 students.

On June 28, 2026, the Program submitted a response to the violations.

On August 10, 2026, the Program submitted an in-depth comprehensive analysis of the Program.

On August 14, 2026, the Program Director notified the NEC that the College is under new ownership. The new owners are Westcliff University.

Since the approval of the New Program Director, the Program has been responsive to all BVNPT requests and submitted all required reports, and the Program has had no further student complaints.

On August 4, 2026, due to cancellation of the August Board meeting, the Executive officer denied the Program's request for an October class and referred the Program to the October 2026 Board meeting.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The NEC conducted an onsite inspection and reviewed and analyzed the documents provided by the Program Director to verify adequate resources including clinical facilities and classrooms to accommodate the students' learning needs and ability to meet the Program's approved objectives. Four violations were identified. Two of the violations have been corrected.

The Program's average annual NCLEX-PN® pass rates for first time candidates have remained non-compliant for four consecutive quarters (July 2025 through June 2026). The Program's pass rate currently is 18 percentage points below the state.

The NEC reviewed and analyzed the submitted documents provided by the Program Director to verify adequate resources including clinical facilities and classrooms to accommodate the students' learning needs and ability to meet the Program's approved objectives.

The Program analysis did not address the admission and screening or the theory or clinical make up violations identified during the Program's continued approval site visit..

Submitted documentation by the Program Director substantiates adequate resources including faculty and facilities for students to achieve programmatic learning objectives.

Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.

The \$5000 fee for program review was submitted and processed on May 8, 2026.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Grant continued approval on a provisional status for the Pacific College, Costa Mesa, Vocational Nursing Program beginning May 10, 2026. and issue a certificate accordingly.
2. Place the Program on the July 2027 Board Agenda for reconsideration of provisional approval.
3. Approve a class of 20 students to commence on October 20, 2026, with a graduation date of August 27, 2028. The class replaces the class that graduated on November 9, 2025.
4. Require the Program to comply with all requirements listed below

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Continue to require the Program to submit comprehensive analysis reports in four months, but no later than February 1, 2027. The reports must include a comprehensive analysis of the Program, timeline for implementation, and the effect of employed interventions. The following elements must be addressed in the analysis.
 - a. Terminal Objectives
 - b. Evaluation of Current Curriculum including:
 - 1) Instructional Plan
 - 2) Daily Lesson Plans for each Term
 - c. Student Policies including:
 - 1) Admission Criteria
 - 2) Screening and Selection Criteria
 - 3) Attendance Policy
 - 4) Remediation Policy
 - 5) Evaluation Methodology for Student Progress including evaluation of clinical practice
 - 6) Credit Granting Policy
 - d. Evaluations of approved clinical facilities which determine adequacy in number and variety of patients to accommodate current and projected student enrollment.
 - e. Faculty Meeting Methodology
 - f. Documentation of resources, including faculty and facilities, for all terms for all current cohorts.
2. Admit no additional classes without prior approval by the Board.
3. Require the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, to:

- a. Submit all documentation in final form, using the forms provided by the BVNPT, no later than by the fifteenth day of the second month preceding the month of the Board meeting.
 - b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Ensure that the Program maintains an average annual pass rate that is compliant with the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l).
4. Require the Program to provide a maximum of ten students for each instructor. The California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(d) states: “for supervision of clinical experience, there shall be a maximum of 15 students for each instructor.” Recommendation of one instructor for a maximum of ten students in clinical experiences will enable more focused instruction and enhanced learning to closely monitor and evaluate the clinical performance of students.
5. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
6. Continue the Program’s requirement to comply with all of the approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code, Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
7. Require the Program to demonstrate incremental progress in NCLEX-PN® licensure examination pass rates, attendance policy and actively administering the program. If the Program fails to satisfactorily demonstrate incremental progress, the full Board may revoke the Program’s approval.
8. Failure to take any of these corrective actions may cause the Board to revoke the Program’s approval, as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526.1(e).
9. Any material changes in circumstances affecting any information contained in the documents submitted by the Program to the Board requires the Program to notify the NEC immediately, in writing, per California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526(g).

Continuing Approval Survey

In accordance with Section 2883 of the California Business and Professions Code, it is the Board’s duty, through an official representative, to inspect or review all schools of vocational nursing in California. Written reports of the representatives’ visit, or inspection, shall be made to the Board. Such inspections determine Program compliance with Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16.

The Pacific College, Costa Mesa, Vocational Nursing Program was reviewed to determine compliance with Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16. The findings are seen within the table below. Four violations were identified. Two violations have been corrected.

RELEVANT PROGRAM ELEMENTS

Enrollment

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(k) states:

The program shall have prior Board approval to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of admission of classes. Criteria to evaluate a school's request to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of class admissions include but are not limited to: (1) Sufficient program resources as specified in Section 2530(a). (2) Adequacy of clinical experience as specified in Section 2534. (3) Licensure examination pass rates as specified in Section 2530(l).

The Program is approved to offer a 74-week part-time evening class. BVNPT approval is required prior to the admission of each class.

The following table represents current and proposed and student enrollment based on current class and projected starts and completion dates. The table indicates a maximum enrollment of 51 students for the period June 2024 through October 2026.

Licensing Examination Statistics

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l) states:

The program shall maintain a yearly average minimum pass rate on the licensure examination that does not fall below 10 percentage points of the state average pass rate for first time candidates of approved vocational nursing schools for the same period.

The following statistics, furnished by Pearson Vue and published by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing as “Jurisdictional Summary of All First-Time Candidates Educated in Member Board Jurisdiction,” for the period July 2024 through June 2026, specify the pass percentage rate for graduates of the Program on the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical/Vocational Nurses (NCLEX-PN®) and the variance from the state average annual pass rates.

*The Annual Pass Rate changes every quarter. It is calculated by dividing the number of candidates who passed during the current and previous three quarters by the number of candidates who tested during the same period. If no data is available for the relevant period, the statistic is carried over from the last quarter for which data is available.

Based on the most current data available (April – June 2026), the Program's average annual pass rate is 63 percent. The California average annual pass rate for graduates from approved vocational nursing programs who took the NCLEX-PN® for the first time during the same period is 81 percent. The average annual pass rate for the Program is 18 percentage points below the state average annual pass rate.

Faculty and Facilities

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(d) states:

For supervision of clinical experience, there shall be a maximum of 15 students for each instructor.

The current number of approved faculty totals 25, including the Program Director. The Program Director has 100 percent administrative duties. Of the total faculty, 24 are designated to teach clinical. The Program is required to provide a maximum of ten students for each instructor. Based upon a maximum proposed enrollment of 51 students, and the required ten students to one instructor while on provisional approval, six instructors are required for clinical supervision. The utilization of faculty at clinical facilities is such that clinical instruction is covered adequately.

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(b) states:

Schools shall have clinical facilities adequate as to number, type, and variety of patients treated, to provide clinical experience for all students in the areas specified by Section 2533. There must be available for student assignment, an adequate daily census of patients to afford a variety of clinical experiences consistent with competency-based objectives and theory being taught. Clinical objectives which students are expected to master shall be posted on patient care units utilized for clinical experience.

Submitted documentation indicates the Program has sufficient clinical facilities to afford the number, type and variety of patients that will provide clinical experience consistent with Board-approved competency-based objectives and theory being taught for current and proposed student enrollment.

Program Inspection

On May 19 and 20, 2026, two Nursing Education Consultants conducted an announced program inspection of Pacific College, Costa Mesa.

Campus Description

The Program is offered within a clean, maintained building and there are ample parking spaces for the students. The campus contains three classrooms, one with 36 student seats, one with 30 seats, and one with 19 seats. Each classroom has a whiteboard with projector, and faculty desk with computer. The Program has one computer lab with 19 seats for proctored testing. The Resource Center contains a wall of reference books for students to utilize and offers an online library. The program has two skills labs that are well stocked and contains a sink and a total of 11 patient care units with adult, pediatric and OB manikins. There is a student break area with four tables with four chairs each, two microwaves, and two vending machines.

Interview with Faculty

A Teams meeting interview was conducted with seven faculty members. The instructors had been teaching in the Program from one to four years. All instructors were happy with the Program and felt that they had support from the Program Director. The faculty members denied any concerns, stating they work well as a team and were supportive of each other to ensure best practices in teaching were implemented. The things they liked best about the Program the communication between the faculty members. The instructors knew where the instructional plan was housed and presented lesson plans based on the instructional plan. The faculty were able to verbalize the attendance policy and process for make-up hours. In addition, they explained the remediation policy and process.

Interview with Students

The interview consisted of four of term three students. All students agreed they would recommend the Program to family members or friends. Students stated the best part of the Program was the direct-patient care clinical experience and support of instructors. Skills-lab hours are conducted on campus in small groups. Students stated clinical hours are completed at direct-patient care settings.

Interview with Program Director

A discussion with the Program Director took place at the end of the day. All elements of the site inspection were addressed, and the Program Director verbalized understanding of the violations identified. The Program Director stated her plan of correction and timeframe in which she would have the plan to the BVNPT.

Violations

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526(j)(1) requires an institution, as a condition for the continued approval of a postsecondary school or educational program offering a course of instruction in vocational nursing, to submit a completed "Continuing Approval Application for a Vocational Nursing School or Program," Form 55M-15 (New 04/2022), the requirements of which are incorporated by reference into the section.

Violation #1

Form 55M-15, at Section 17 on page 6, Evaluation Methodology for Clinical Facilities states to attach an explanation of the process and identify the tool(s) i.e., surveys, forms, and checklists used by the program to evaluate the clinical facilities and attach unredacted clinical facility evaluations based on the stated methodology. The reviews should cover the past 18 months as a sample size.

Violation: According to the program's evaluation methodology for clinical facilities the Program Director or designee, instructors, and students are required to complete the evaluation form for the clinical facilities to ensure the facility can meet the required objectives for the clinical experiences. Only students completed the evaluation checklist.

Status: The violation is corrected.

On June 28, 2026, The Program director completed and submitted facility evaluations for all clinical facilities used since January 2025. Additionally, student and instructor facility evaluations were submitted.

Violation #2

Form 55M-18, at Section 17 on page 6, Admission Criteria states to attach an explanation of the policy requirements for admission to the school or program. Documentation must include verification for current students enrolled in the program

that the program follows its admission policy. For example, student's entrance examination results, health requirements, letters of recommendation, if noted in the program's stated admission policy.

Violation: The program has a submitted policy regarding the admission procedures and requirements. The files provided did not contain the student's admission test scores or evidence of being 17 years of age on admission.

Status: The violation is **not** corrected.

Violation #3

Form 55M-18, at Section 23 on page 7, Remediation states to attach the remediation policy and a copy of completed remediation forms or documentation of remediation for each student: (a) currently in remediation (b) previously in remediation during any time over the past 18 months; (c) or a document stating that there are no students on remediation for your program.

Violation: The program submitted their policy regarding remediation and a document stating no students are on remediation. During the onsite program inspection there were several students who had recently received remediation. Remediation is completed by student services not an instructor. There were no objectives identified that the students must meet, no assignments, and no reevaluation of student understanding or learning documented on the forms evaluated.

Status: The violation is corrected.

On June 28, 2026, the Program revised and submitted the remediation policy, student success plan, and a documentation form to follow students remediation and learning. Four completed forms were submitted identifying current remediation, identifying that the new remediation process is active.

Violation #4

Form 55M-18, at Section 24 on page 7, Attendance Policy states to attach a current copy of the attendance policy and unredacted records/rosters of all student absences for the current terms or semesters. The record/roster must include the student's name and length of absence(s). If the attendance policy does not specify, list the types of make-up assignment used for theory, skills lab and clinical experience.

Violation: The Program does not follow the Program's attendance policy. During evaluation of student attendance during the program site visit it was identified that four student files contained:

- 1- Probation letters for student attendance issues but no warning letters.
- 2- Students had missed more than the approved number of absences within the term.
- 3- Make-up forms did not provide missed hours, only the hours made up.
- 4- Forms did not provide objectives that the students were to complete for clinical make-up.

Status: The violation is **not** corrected.

**PACIFIC COLLEGE, COSTA MESA,
VOCATIONAL NURSING PROGRAM**

Program History

- On June 26, 1998, the Board approved Pacific College's request to commence a vocational nursing program consisting of 578 theory hours and 964 clinical hours, with an initial class of 30 students on July 20, 1998, contingent upon the approval of adequate faculty and facilities by July 1, 1998. Due to problems with federal funding for students, the start date was delayed. The Program commenced January 11, 1999.
- On September 17, 1999, the Board accredited the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program, effective for the initial class commencing January 11, 1999, and approved admission of 30 students on December 22, 1999. (Note: Prerequisites for prospective students in the December class commenced on September 27, 1999, beginning with the Certified Nursing Assistant class.)
- On February 4, 2000, the Board approved the admission of 30 students on February 14, 2000. This class started prerequisite courses on February 28, 2000, and the vocational nursing program on May 8, 2000.
- On June 16, 2000, the Board approved the admission of 15 full-time students on August 28, 2000 (the class actually started on September 25, 2000), and 30 full-time students on December 11, 2000, only, contingent upon Board approval of an adequate number of clinical instructors and commencement of a part-time class of 15 students on September 19, 2000, only.

The Board requested that a follow-up report on student licensure examination performance be presented at the September 29, 2000, Board meeting. The report was to include an analysis of the causes of poor student performance on the licensure examination and identify goals, solutions, and timelines to improve examination pass rates. The Program Director was also asked to address reasons students delay taking the licensure examination following graduation. The deadline for the written report was July 25.

- On September 29, 2000, the Board accepted the follow-up report on student licensure examination performance. A follow-up report that included an analysis by the Program Director of student performance on the licensure examination, based on the Program Director's plan of correction was presented at the February 2001 Board meeting. The Board approved the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program's request to admit 15 full-time students and 15 part-time students on December 11, 2000.
- On February 2, 2001, the Board accepted the follow-up report on student licensure examination performance. The Board requested a follow-up report be presented at the September 7, 2001, Board meeting to include an analysis by the Program Director of student performance on the licensure examination based on her plan to improve pass rates. The report included, but was not limited to, the

number of students who were taking the NCLEX-PN® review class offered by the Program and the results of the student evaluations of the Program and preparedness to take the exam.

- The Board denied the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program's request to admit 30 full-time students on April 9, 2001. The Board approved admission of 15 students to the full-time Program on April 9, 2001, only.
- On April 27, 2001, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in both the full-time and part-time Programs to commence June 4, 2001, only.
- On June 29, 2001, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in both the full-time and part-time Programs to commence August 6, 2001, only.
- On September 7, 2001, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program on October 8, 2001, only, to replace students who graduate on September 18, 2001, and the Board also approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time Program on October 9, 2001, only, to replace students who graduate on September 30, 2001.
- On November 16, 2001, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program on January 28, 2002, only, to replace students who graduated on January 20, 2002, and the Board also approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time Program on January 28, 2002, only to replace students who graduated on January 8, 2002.
- On February 28, 2002, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program and 15 students in the part – time Program on March 3, 2002, only.
- On April 12, 2002, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time and part-time Programs on May 20, 2002, only.
- On June 28, 2002, the Board approved continued full accreditation for the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program for a four-year period from April 12, 2002, to April 12, 2006, and issued a certificate, accordingly, and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program starting July 29, 2002, only, to replace the class graduating July 17, 2002, and 15 students in the part-time Program starting July 30, 2002, only.
- On September 6, 2002, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full- time Program starting September 23, 2002, only, to replace the class graduating September 30, 2002, 15 students in the part-time track 1-A Program starting September 23, 2002, only, to replace the class graduating September 15, 2002, and 15 students in the part-time track 11-B Program starting September 24, 2002, only, to replace the class graduating September 19, 2002.
- On November 8, 2002, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full and part-time Programs starting November 18, 2002, only.
- On February 21, 2003, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full- time class starting February 24, 2003, only, to replace the class that

graduated January 1, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time track 1-C class starting February 25, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated January 26, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time class starting March 10, 2003, only, to replace the class that will complete February 12, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in an additional part-time track 1-1 class on March 10, 2003, only.

- On April 11, 2003, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time class starting May 19, 2003, only, to replace the class graduating April 25, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in track 1-D class starting May 19, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated May 11, 2003.
- On June 19, 2003, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time class starting July 21, 2003, only, to replace the class which graduated on July 11, 2003, and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in track 1-B on July 21, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated June 8, 2003.
- On September 19, 2003, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time class starting September 22, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated September 5, 2003; and the Board approved the Program's request to admit a part-time class of 15 students in track 1-E on September 23, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated September 7, 2003.
- On October 14, 2003, the Board sent a letter to the Program indicating that its average annual licensure examination pass rates for the past four consecutive quarters were more than 10 percentage points below the state average annual pass rate. Thus, the Program is not in compliance with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l). Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program was asked to submit a written plan for improving the Program's NCLEX-PN® pass rates. The plan is to be submitted by November 14, 2003.
- On November 19, 2003, the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program starting November 24, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated October 24, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time track 1-F Program starting November 25, 2003, only, to replace the class that graduated November 14, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the full-time Program starting January 19, 2004, only, to replace the class that graduated December 19, 2003 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time track 1-G Program starting January 19, 2004, only, to replace the class graduating January 11, 2004 and the Board approved the admission of 15 students in the part-time track 1-J Program starting January 20, 2004, only, to replace the class which graduated January 11, 2004.
- On January 12, 2004, a change in Program Directors took place and the new Program Director and administrator attended the *New Director Orientation* on January 21, 2004.
- On February 20, 2004, the Board approved the admission of 15 students into the

full-time Program starting on March 22, 2004, only, to replace students that graduated on February 20, 2004 and approved the admission of 15 students into the part-time track 1-A Program starting March 22, 2004, only, to replace the students graduated on March 14, 2004 and approved the admission of 15 students into the full-time Program starting on May 17, 2004, only, to replace the students that graduated on April 30, 2004 and approved the admission of 15 students into the part-time track 1-H Program starting May 18, 2004, only, to replace the students that graduated on May 9, 2004.

The Program's current pattern of admission includes 6 full-time classes and 6 part-time classes, each, admitting 15 students to each class.

- On October 14, 2010, the Board approved continued full accreditation for the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program for the period May 12, 2010, through May 11, 2014, and issued a certificate accordingly and continued the Program's approval for a pattern of admission, which to replace graduating students, only, with the following stipulations:
- No additional classes are added to the Program's approved pattern of admission without prior Board approval. The Program's approved pattern of admission includes four full-time classes of 30 students and twelve part-time classes of 30

students per year.

- The Program Director documents that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
- On July 18, 2014, the Executive Officer continued full approval for the Pacific College Vocational Nursing Program for the period May 11, 2014, through May 10, 2018, and issued a certificate accordingly. Additionally, approval of the Program's pattern of admission, to replace graduating students, only, with the following stipulations was continued:
 1. No additional classes are added to the Program's approved pattern of admissions without prior Board approval. The Program's approved pattern of admission includes four full-time classes of 30 students and twelve (part-time classes of 30 students only.

 - 2) Documentation verifying sufficient resources, staff, physical space, equipment, and materials as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(a).
 - 3) Approval of clinical facilities sufficient to afford the number type and variety of patients that will provide clinical experiences consistent with competency-based objectives and theory, for the proposed student enrollment, as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(b).
 - 4) Submission of documentation verifying BPPE approval.
- Rationale: The Program is currently compliant with all sections of Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16. However, at this time the Program does not have adequate faculty and facilities to offer the proposed classes. The Program has retained RN Faculty Recruiters that

will ensure adequate Nurse Instructor levels and will hire a Registered Nurse who has extensive experience in successfully expanding existing and new student capacity at clinical training sites. The Program agrees to provide the Board with applications for faculty and facilities adequate for the proposed enrollment prior to admitting a class.

The Program is in the process of obtaining BPPE approval for the part time and full-time classes at Chino Valley Unified and is aware that BPPE approval is required prior to admitting students at any additional sites.

Board records furnished by Pearson VUE and published by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, substantiate that the Program has remained compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l) with 85.71 percent of the previous 14 consecutive quarters. Based on the most current data available (July - Sept 2015), the Program's average annual pass rate is 82 percent, ten percentage points above the state average annual pass rate.

Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.

 5. Required the Program Director to notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.

6. Continued the Program's requirement to comply with all of the approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code, Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
7. Required the Program to demonstrate incremental progress in NCLEX-PN® licensure examination pass rates, attendance policy and actively administering the program. If the Program fails to satisfactorily demonstrate incremental progress, the full Board may revoke the Program's approval.
8. Failure to take any of these corrective actions may cause the Board to revoke the Program's approval, as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526.1(e).
9. Any material changes in circumstances affecting any information contained in the documents submitted by the Program to the Board requires the Program to notify the NEC immediately, in writing, per California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526(g).
